Tip: If you are creating a heavy eye and heavy lip, make sure to go easy on the cheek color.

## Luscious Lips

Line lips with liner making sure to use a heavier application on the outside corners. Using a lip brush, coat evenly with a lipstick. To create a sultry pout, use gloss in the upper and lower middle lip. To make a precise line around lips, go back with a tiny point concealer brush.



\*The dotted line above represents the areas to apply the heavier liner and gloss.



## Dramatic Eyes

It is really fun to play with different eye colors and this summer is no exception. Throw the old rules out the door and experiment with bold dramatic looks. Add depth by using a highlight, medium and contour shadow and finish the look off with a complimentary liner.



## Blush

Everyone needs a bit of cheek color but make sure to balance it with the other colors on your face. If you are using a red lip, go with a light pink blush. The simpler the better.

## Naturally You

Lea Anna has a naturally beautiful complexion. We used a palette of soft pastels on her warm skin to create a summer glow that emphasizes her natural pigmentation. We love this barely-there look for the summer season.

**Tip:** Use a tinted moisturizer with SPF to protect your skin from harmful UV rays and for a natural glow.

## Get Cheeky

For a natural look, the goal is to make it appear that you are actually blushing. Start on the apple of the cheek, softly sweeping the color back in layers. Sweep outward and up instead of painting a heaving straight line. It is ok to use dual cheek colors.



## Pink Lips

Avoid browns and reds for a natural look. Pick a pretty pink lipstick with gloss for soft sophistication.



## Pastel Eyes

By choosing berry-color pastel colors you can achieve a summer look without a lot of fuss. Minimize mascara and hit the beach looking great.

## Bronze Sand

### MODEL: ARABELLA MOORE

The experts at MD Minerals were able to create a bronzed look on Arabella's fair skin without looking caked on or unnatural. Balance a sun-kissed face with a coral lip for a bright, summer glow.

Tip: By using an all-over powder like Café Au Lait, the experts were able to create a light, natural look.



## Eyeliner

To achieve the wet to dry eyeliner, follow these simple steps:

1. Dip angled brush into a splash of mineral water to moisten the brush.
2. Dip brush into color to create a paste.
3. Apply as close to the lash line as possible.

\* For this look, we extended the liner out to open the eye up by using the Godiva shadow mixed with Copper Flushing for contour.

## The Perfect Shadow

The perfect shadow is hard to accomplish but by combining four shadows in various parts of the eyelid, it is easily achieved. First, start with an eyeshadow highlight all over the lid, like Sand. Next, use a medium shadow from the top of the lid to crease, like Panning for Gold. Then, apply a contour shadow in a "v" in outer corner of eye, like Copper Flushing. Finish the look with the wet to dry eyeliner, like example above.



## Coral Lips

The color coral is hot this season. We love the color for clothing but love it more on lips. It is important to try different shades of coral to find one right for you.
